## AIDS WALK FUNDRAISING SURPASSES LAST YEAR WITH \$2.27 MILLION RAISED FOR BAY AREA ORGANIZATIONS

**SAN FRANCISCO**, **July 19, 2015** – Thousands of people gathered in Golden Gate Park in a powerful outpouring of support for AIDS Walk San Francisco (AWSF) and the organizations that benefit from it. The amount raised climbed above last year's total in a promising reversal following a years-long downward trend in AIDS fundraising throughout the country.

The landmark community event raises funds for Project Inform and a coalition of 42 Bay Area AIDS service organizations. These groups provide direct support for people living with HIV/AIDS, vital HIV prevention services, and critical advocacy efforts to end the epidemic.

AIDS Walk Founder and Senior Organizer, Craig R. Miller, spoke to the year's successes at the event's Opening Ceremonies. "This has been a remarkable day for AIDS Walk San Francisco. I am so proud of the Bay Area community for such a strong show of support and continued perseverance in the fight against HIV/AIDS," said Miller. "Today's fundraising total of \$2,270,533 marks a resurgent moment in our work and makes it clear that our community is re-energized and ready to fight for HIV-positive people from *all* over the Bay Area."

"On behalf of Project Inform and the 42 agencies from throughout the Bay Area that benefit from AIDS Walk San Francisco, I want to extend a profound thanks to the 20,000 community members whose astounding fundraising efforts ensure the future of vital services that support those living with or at risk for HIV/AIDS," said Dana Van Gorder, Executive Director of Project Inform. Elected Officials included California United States Congresswoman Barbara Lee, State Assemblymember David Chiu, San Francisco Supervisor Scott Wiener, San Francisco Treasurer José Cisneros, Alameda Mayor Trish Spencer, and Daly City Mayor Raymond Buenaventura.
